Alexander the Great occupied and forced massive weddings between his 10,000 soldiers and women in Susa in 324 B.C.

Later it oscillated between Seleucid (305-63 B.C) and Parthia (247 B.C -224 A.D).

During Sassanid period, many Christians were persecuted (224-651 A.D).

Muslims occupied it in 642 A.D, and Mongols destroyed it in 1218 A.D.
