Question. Do you see any similarity or difference on the image of a shepherd between those Old Testament passages and John chapter 10?

II. Festival of Dedication (Another name for Hanukkah)

The festival instituted to commemorate the purging of the temple and the rebuilding of the altar after Judas Maccabbeus had driven out the Syrians, B.C. 164 (1 Maccabees 4:52-59). It commenced on the 25th of Chisleu (early in December) the anniversary of the pollution of the temple by Antiochus Epiphanes, B.C. 167. Like the great Mosaic feasts, it lasted eight days, but it did not require attendance at Jerusalem. It was an occasion of much festivity, and was celebrated in nearly the same manner as the feast of tabernacles (September or October), with the carrying of branches of trees and with much singing. In the temple at Jerusalem the "Hallel" was sung every day of the feast. – Easton's Bible Dictionary

As well as celebrating the rededication of the temple, Jews also used the Feast of Dedication to reflect on the consequences of bad leadership. One of the passages that was commonly read and discussed was Ezekiel 34, which denounces and describes Israel's past poor leaders as bad shepherds, men who fulfilled their own desires rather than serve their sheep. – livehope.org
