## b. Four Days Late

When Jesus finally arrives in Bethany, Lazarus has been dead for four days. This note is significant. There was a well-known Jewish belief (attested from about A.D 200) that the soul of a dead person remained in the vicinity of the body "hoping to reenter it" for three days, but once decomposition set in, the soul departed. John wants us to know clearly that Lazarus is truly dead and that the miracle of Jesus cannot be construed as a resuscitation. — *John: NIV Application Commentary*, Gary M. Burge
