Their actions were not saving anyone.

To the Persecuted (vv. 7-8)

Be patient until the coming of the Lord

As farmers are patient until the time of harvest (v. 7)

Be patient until the coming of the Lord

for the coming of the Lord is near (v. 8)

A life forgiven and justified (vv. 9-20)

Do not grumble but be patient (vv. 9-10)

Do not swear but praise and pray (vv. 12-18)

Do not swear (v. 12)

Praise (v. 13)

Pray (vv. 14-16)
